Board Dismissal for Failure to State a Claim under Board Law or Regulations

On April 11, 2017, Petitioner Jill Chlan filed an Unfair Labor Practice Complaint (“ULP Complaint”) against the Maryland Professional Employees Council (“MPEC”). In her ULP Complaint, Petitioner alleges that MPEC failed to represent her when her supervisor required her to sign a blank mid-year performance evaluation, and subsequently filled out the evaluation and placed it in Petitioner’s personnel file.

Petitioner’s ULP Complaint is deficient in that Petitioner fails to state a claim under the State Personnel and Pensions Article Section 3-306, or under corresponding Board regulations at COMAR 14.32.05, *et seq.*, upon which relief may be appropriately granted.


Accordingly, the ULP Complaint is dismissed.
