Board Dismissal for Lack of Jurisdiction

On January 25, 2018, Petitioner Margaret Jane Jaegly (“Jaegly”) filed an unfair labor practice complaint before the State Labor Relations Board (“Board”), pursuant to COMAR 14.32.05. In her complaint, Jaegly alleges that Respondent, Genesis Corsica Hills Nursing Center (GCHNC) did not pay Jaegly for her unused vacation time upon her resignation. Further, Jaegly alleges that when she submitted her resignation she inquired about her unused vacation time and alleges that she had “at least three” conversations with her supervisor, in which the supervisor stated that Jaegly would be paid for that unused time, and that the payment would be made to her in the December 22, 2017 pay. Jaegly states that she agreed to this time frame. However, as of the date of the filing of this claim, Jaegly has received no payments from GCHNC, and no notification that GCHNC would not be paying her for her unused vacation time.

Jaegly’s complaint is deficient in that her complaint also fails to demonstrate that Jaegly is an employee of any of the units of State government described in State Personnel & Pension Article §3-102(a).

Accordingly, this complaint is dismissed due to a lack of Board jurisdiction to consider the complaint.


