Board Dismissal for Failure to State a Claim under Board Law or Regulations, & Lack of Jurisdiction

On November 18, 2014, Petitioner Darise Dobbins filed an unfair labor practice complaint before the State Labor Relations Board ("Board"), pursuant to COMAR 14.32.05. In her complaint, Ms. Dobbins alleges that she was "railroaded out" of the store where she worked for twenty-eight years.

Petitioner's complaint is deficient in numerous respects. First, Petitioner failed to file a certificate of service, attesting that the complaint had been served upon the Respondent, pursuant to COMAR 14.32.02.12. Petitioner's complaint also fails to demonstrate that Petitioner is an employee of any of the units of State government described in State Personnel & Pension Article §3-102(a). Finally, Petitioner fails to allege any violation as defined in State Personnel & Pensions Article, §3-306.

Accordingly, this complaint is administratively dismissed, because of deficient service, failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted, and a lack of Board jurisdiction to consider the complaint.
